IN MEMORIAM

FLAVIO BRIVIO, WAKO PIONEER AND ONE OF THE FIRST WAKO REFEREES **HAS PASSED AWAY**



Flavio Brivio, the honorary member of the WAKO Referee Committee passed away on October 8, 2017, after a long and severe illness, aged 71.

Flavio was born on November 2, 1947, in Gallarate (Varese), close to Milan in Italy. He was one of the first Italian kickboxing referees and first chairman of the WAKO Referee Committee. He was the chief referee on many WAKO championships before 2001. During the WAKO World Championships in Belgrade 2001, he had his last international referee duty.

His kickboxing biography is linked to Ennio Falsoni, who was the President of the FIAM (Italian Martial Arts Federation) at that time. Ennio and Flavio were close friends.

In his early ages Flavio was affiliated to the club ASD Atletico Kickboxing Lainate (Milan), where Ennio used to teach. Flavio was one of his students and later on became one of the pioneers of kickboxing as a referee and a judge in the FIAM around mid-70's (1974/75).


Once Ennio became the new WAKO President in 1984, he introduced Flavio on the international level, he started to travel a lot with the Italian team. He held referee seminars and was a mentor to many referees, deserving a title as an honorary member of the WAKO Referee Committee.

Flavio Brivio was a great man and really an expert as a kickboxing referee. When he was on tatami or in the ring as a chief referee, everyone knew that all decisions were accurate, fair and honest. He helped many today's judges, referees and chief referees and officials to become the best.

Now when Flavio has left us, the WAKO has lost a great man, a great referee, a teacher and a master and a big friend, a fan and supporter of kickboxing, who has made a huge contribution to the development of kickboxing Italy and the World.

On behalf of the WAKO and its members, we express the condolences to the Flavio's family and to the Italian Kickboxing Federation.

IOC Athlete Career Program (ACP) in WAKO

With support from the IOC, WAKO has conducted its first Train the Trainer session within the IOC ACP, a pilot in order for WAKO staff to deliver parts of the ACP outreach program for athletes or coaching them in a right direction.

A mix of delegates from WAKO Athlete Committee, Coach Committee, and Women Committee participated in this pilot and it was conducted as a workshop. The delegates were introduced to the ACP program and tested various tasks and tools as a part of the ACP program. The objective is to give WAKO staff the possibility during the coming championships to organize small workshops and seminars for our athletes.

ACP as a service should become important in the WAKO, and our objective is to develop a mechanism that can educate athletes in career planning, raising awareness of the importance of combining an athletic career with preparation/transition for life after sport. The IOC ACP is based on three pillars; education, employment, and life skills.

PRESENTATIONS / LENGTH / TIME

There are no time limits for any musical forms categories, the competitor starts his / her form after their presentation from their first movement after their presentation, this can be a Trick, Gymnastic or Martial arts technique.

Please Note: If a Competitor performs any Gymnastic techniques or Weapon Releases in their Presentation these will be counted as part of their form.

SIGN FOR THE FUTURE

WAKO became a partner of one more International organization which deals with Women in sport issue.

International Working Group on Women and Sport IWG is International organization from Gaborone, Botswana, dealing with gender equality and women presence in sport in all levels, forcing initiatives to promote physical activity, offering men and women equal opportunities in the sport arena and enlisting men as allies in the fight for gender equality.

On 4th March 2017 during Irish Open International for Peace and Sport WAKO Cup, it was organized the ceremony of signing the agreement between two parties, which means that WAKO has signed and adopted Brighton Plus Helsinki 2014 Declaration on Women and Sport.

Declaration was signed by Ms. Kristina Thuree, IWG European representative and by WAKO President, Mr. BorislavPelevic, witnessed by WAKO Women Committee chairman Ms. Kate Kociszewska and WAKO Women Committee member Ms. Marijana Pelevic. International Working Group on Women and Sport is International organization from Gaborone, Botswana, dealing with gender equality and women presence in sport in all levels.

Every four year IWG has Conferences which are "milestone events, which every four years focus global attention on specific goals and action steps aimed at offering men and women equal opportunities in the sport arena.

The economic, social and cultural impact of the many hundreds of delegates representing nations from all continents is significant and has resulted in concrete benefits for the previous host countries."

The list of the Conferences:

1994 Brighton, UK. 1998. Windhoek, Namibia. 2002. Montreal Canada. 2006. Kumamoto, Japan. 2010. Sidney, Australia. 2014. Helsinki, Finland.

The last Conference held in Finland they find most important because of the Declaration: "Helsinki calls the world of sport to Lead the Change and Be the Change.", where they had about 830 people from almost 100 countries, who took part in the groundbreaking event that laid down the updated principles for advancing women's and girls' sport and physical activity globally.

What is IWG?

"The IWG is a critical link between representatives of international, regional and national organizations interested in women and sport issues, making the IWG World Conferences important opportunities for interaction and discussion.

The main aim is working towards gender equality and equal participation of women and girls in sport at all levels and roles."

IWG International relations

The 441 various organizations have notified the International Working Group on Women and Sport (IWG) that they have endorsed the Brighton Declaration on Women and Sport (1994). Among them is WAKO.

The presence of Ms. Kristina Thuree on the WAKO Cup was the great occasion to introduce our sport kickboxing and to arrange a meeting with WAKO Women Committee, where important issues of implementing principles of the Declaration were discussed.

The most important highlight of this partnership for WAKO is to clearly step forward in work towards gender equality and equal participation of women and girls in kickboxing sport at all levels and roles: as athletes, coaches, referees and executive officials. For the WAKO, the goal is clear: we already reached the number of 35% female athletes in WAKO, but we have to focus on including more women in executive bodies of the organization.

For more than twenty years, the beginning of March is the time when the world kickboxing checkpoint is in Dublin. The 2017 edition of the Irish Open International Cup extended its name with: Peace and Sport (Irish Open International Cup for Peace and Sport). This was the sign of a new era of the WAKO. starting an active cooperation with the World's organization Peace&Sport. It was good opportunity to host high ranked guests from international sport organizations during the Irish Open. The WAKO had the opportunity to host Mr. Joel Bouzou, Peace&Sport President with his closest colleague Ms. Iris Vlachoutsicos, a representative of the ISPCC, Irish Society for the protection of Children, where every year Irish Open Kickboxing tournament donates money, Ms. Kristina Thuree from the European sector of the IWG, Mr. Tibor Kozsla, a representative of the Elearning Academy, Mr. Mike Joyce, the IOC representative, and as every year, the highest representatives of Irish government and representatives of Irish sports organizations and the Ministry of sport.

The sports hall was full of energy while all the participants in the competition raised their hands with a white card in it, showing solidarity to peace and tolerance. The Peace&Sport has launched a campaign which has brought together a group of

The Austrian Classics WAKO World Cup Innsbruck, 21st-23rd April 2017

ANNIVERSARY OF THE SUCCESS

20th Anniversary for great kickboxing tournament this year was a celebration of sport and fair play. 32 nations represented with 2176 entries in the event from 242 clubs made this Austrian Classics special again.

K1, Full contact, kick light, light contact and point fighting were disciplined on the schedule.

Even the host had one of the numerous teams - 326 athletes, the most numerous were Italian team: a record of 398 athletes confirmed Italy as one of the best kickboxing nations in WAKO.

Even Iraq (2) and the United States (7) had its representatives, what makes this tournament even more prestigious.

Italy, Austria, Germany, Hungary and Czech Republic were five the best nations in the medals statistics.

In the ranking order the best teams/clubs are:

- 1. Czech full contact union (Cze),
- 2. Kiralyteam Kickboxing Academy (Hun) and
- 3. Kickboxing zveza Slovenie (Slo).

Grand Champion in Junior male division was Everill Eliah, Team Top Ten UK and Grand Champion open weight senior male again this year was Roman Brundl.

Grand Champion junior female trophy went to Angelino Domenica, Team Barrus Italy and in the senior division, the best lady was Nagy Henrietta Kiralyteam Kickboxing Academy.

Point Fighting Grand Champion Open Weight Seniors male was the category with the highest number of entries: 38 in total and behind goes category point fighting senior men -79 kg with the 34 entries.

WAKO President was present at the Cup as well as the major of the Innsbruck, who was extremely interested in WAKO disciplines and competitions.

INTERVIEW WITH JULIE SOLWOLD

Vice president and PR of Lifestyle Sports for John Paul Mitchell Systems in the United States

THE SECRET OF SUCCESS



1. What is the main thing that you are doing with John Paul Mitchell systems team?

-We have been doing this for 30 years now, and when we started we were primarily a fighting team. In the past 30 years, as Forms and Weapons have grown in popularity with the younger generation. We realized that kids like to be challenged by something creative, which is why we expanded so greatly into Forms. You have to keep the integrity of the martial arts in every discipline, but you have to be open to change to be relevant to a new generation.

2. What is the background of the Musical forms?

-It's a form that is choreographed to music. Different disciplines can allow flips, spins, kicks, aerials and very difficult gymnastic-type moves, but the routine must always be rooted in the fundamentals of the martial arts. It is not a dance performance, it is always based on solid martial arts moves.

3. Do Paul Mitchell competitors compete as regular kick boxers in the ring or on the tatami, or just as the musical forms?

-In general, most of the Forms competitors don't fight very often. It takes a different skill set to be a Forms competitor than a Fighter because there are so many creative moves to showcase. You're in the ring by yourself – the judges are scoring you on how you move, not how you hit an opponent. Like any sport, the better you want to be, the more you have to specialize. The fundamentals of Fighting and Forms are the same – the manner of expressing them are very different.

4. How do you manage to do all the work that you have to do? Considering that the United States is huge, and you have to do a lot of traveling from one state to another, isn't it tiring?

-I don't run the team by myself. I have an excellent 5-person executive team that handles the entire Karate Team for the company. They scout for years and select the team members after careful consideration. They are looking for the best competitors from all over the world, and don't just look for the best talent, but for the best character. We will sometimes choose a person who may not be at the top of their division, but they have great character and integrity. We can teach them to be a better competitor. It is important to my company our Team members have a good hearts and always give back.

My Team and I regularly visit children's hospitals and teach the kids there about martial arts. Not only do we teach them, but they teach us. They teach us that we should be grateful for what we have and for the opportunities that have been offered to us.

5. What are your plans for now and for the near future?

- The sport is evolving quickly in the US, and our goal is to grow the Forms and Weapons divisions as quickly internationally, with uniform and universally recognized judging criteria. We must adapt to the changing tastes of the new generations if we want grow. You need to keep it fresh if you want to attract more people into our sport. The new, creative disciplines offer the opportunity to bring new customers in who might not have wanted to do only traditional martial arts. A completely new revenue stream bringing more money into the sport. We want to be a role model to others. We want to encourage other countries to think outside traditional martial arts and get creative with opportunities for new customers. Adapt to the changing market.

6. How do you finance your work?

-It is tough, especially because we live in the USA, where not many sports are funded by the government. My company is privately owned, and the owner, John Paul De Joria, deeply believes in the values that the martial arts were

The American Fighters will fight individually as well, and fight their Team Kiraly teammates in their weight divisions. That is true international Team Fighting!




2nd BOLIVARIAN KICKBOXING CHAMPIONSHIPS

This year edition of Hungarian kickboxing World Cup was a total earthquake of kickboxing during three days of the competition.



It can be said that gold medal of the winners of these categories is the medal with the strongest shine. The **best five nations** were:

Grand champion of Hungarian Cup 2017 in the junior male division is McGlinchey Conor (Ireland), in senior division is Veres Richard (Hungary).

The most numerous team was Hungarian, with 719 participants from 49 kickboxing clubs. There we had Italy with 213 participants from 21 club, Ukraine with 155 participants, Bulgaria with 143 participants, Austria with 125, the United Kingdom with 117, Greece with 108, Poland with 103, and Czech Republic, Slovenia, Slovakia, and Russian Federation with almost a 100 participants per a team.

NEW ELECTED PRESIDENT AND GOVERNING COUNCIL OF WAKO INDIA



National Kickboxing Federation WAKO India held its Extraordinary General Assembly for elections and constitution of permanent Governing Council of WAKO India.

After electing the new President, EPO declared the results of the elections, announced the elected President and closed the elections procedure.

The organization under Mr. Santosh Agrawal proceed with the legal registration with the new name: "WAKO India Kickboxing Federation" and they already have received the confirmation letter from Ministry of Corporate Affairs Government of India.

WAKO Asian Kickboxing Confederation Championships 2016 2017

Ashgabat, Turkmenistan 24th- 30th April 2017.

After the successful organization of K1 Rules Asian Championships during September 2016, Asian Kickboxing Confederation (WAKO ASIA) organized the Asian Kickboxing Confederation Championships from the 24th - 30th of April in the "Pearl of Central Asia" Ashgabat capital of Turkmenistan.

15 Countries from the 5 different zones of the Asian Continent (East, South East, South, Central and West Asia) with their best fighters competed in Full Contact, Low Kick, K1 Rules (in selected categories which were excluded in Korea in September 2016), Light Contact, Kick Light, Point Fighting and Musical forms.

However, this is the first time that Asian Kickboxing Confederation organized WAKO ASIA Championships 2016/2017 with complete Olympic Standard at the occasion of "Inspiring Ashgabat" the Test Event series of competition used for the 5th Asian Indoor & Martial Arts Games at the boasting of the most advanced facilities in the region, the Ashgabat Olympic Complex with the collaboration of the Executive Committee of 5th Asian Indoor & martial Arts Games.

Dr. Borislav Pelevic, WAKO President was present at the event during the two days of the finals and had the opportunity to visit the Olympic Complex. Many officials from the political establishment visited the competition, including the different Ambassadors in duty in Ashgabat such as Islamic Republic of Iran Ambassador His Excellency Seyed Mohammad Ahmadi.

The Chairman of the Sports Committee Turkmenistan greeted WAKO Asia, hundreds of dancers and musicians entered the sports hall and presented a great show combining Turkmenistan's traditions with modern art.

1. From when is Olga in kickboxing and how did you join kickboxing? Tell us about your history in kickboxing.

-I started dancing at the age of 7, and I decided to stop at the age of 14. When I stopped dancing, I took up kickboxing, and I really liked it. I wanted to do it professionally. I won my first championship as a junior when I was 15, and after that, I made a proposal to be a judge. Quickly after becoming a judge, I started working in the kickboxing federation as a lawyer. Now I'm a kickboxing coach, and I train a lot of people who are also interested in kickboxing. I have three college degrees, and I use all of them to do my best in the

- 2. How do you manage to be a President, considering the fact that the Ukrainian federation is so big? Also, do you get support from the Ukrainian government?
- Yes, we do get support from the government, and I am also the Vice-president of the Ukrainian sports committee. I created a very good team in the Ukrainian kickboxing federation, when I first came there, I changed the entire system. It was hard, but it had to be done.
- 3. Do you have fighters in all of the WAKO disciplines?
 - -Yes, we do. The most popular WAKO disciplines in Ukraine are K1 and tatami disciplines.
- 4. What is the main thing we should focus on in the WAKO future?

-WAKO has a very good perspective. I think that we should focus on joining the Olympic games. We are

doing our best to make that happen, and we have high hopes.

⇒ 5. How come that woman are interested in kickboxing when it is considered as a "Mens' sport"? Do people have anything against the fact that a woman is a president of WAKO Ukraine?

-Anyone can be interested in this beautiful sport that we are involved in. No one really minded me being the President as a woman and that's because I'm really doing my best, and I really try to make this federation better every day. So far, we didn't have any problems with discrimination whatsoever.



6. How do you train your coaches and judges?

-Our team provides lessons for future coaches and judges. I am in charge of those lessons. We make sure that everybody gets the training and education that they need because it is really important to have highly educated judges and coaches.

7. How many kickboxing clubs does the Ukrainian federation have?

-We have around 15 clubs in each part of Kiev, the capital city of Ukraine. When they are all combined together, we have around 150 clubs, and approximately 50,000 participants in all of them together.

8. Is it hard to work in such a big environment? How do you manage to make championships?

-We have a huge and an amazing team, which helps us do all the work that we have to do. It is sometimes hard to work in a big environment, but we always get around. The biggest competition that we organized had over 1500 personnel, and it was enormous. It was very hard to organize, but my team and I never even thought about giving up. It's work, it will get tough and hard from time to time, but you cannot give up.



9. What are your plans for the future of the Ukranian federation?

-My personal goal is to learn the English language because it will open a lot more doors for the Ukranian federation because the President has to get around on their own. Also, I am planning to become a candidate for the Vice-president of WAKO Europe, and hopefully win.

10. Where do you find the energy to do all the work that you have to do? Are you training kickboxing at the moment?

-I have to be strong, I cannot be weak. Yes, I do train, every morning before I go to work, I do my training. I do the right exercises for me, and I encourage everyone to do the same.



WAKO WAS WRITING THE PAGES OF HISTORY





For the first time in it's history, the WAKO has participated as an invitational sport in the IWGA WORLD GAMES that took place in the city of Wroclaw, Poland, from 24th to 28th July 2017.

Wroclaw is the city of the region Lower Silesia. It has 640 000 inhabitants, plus 150 000 students who live and study in this University town.

It has a long tradition of organizing prestigious international events: UEFA European Football Championship, Theatre Olympics, The Gala of European Film Awards, Volleyball World Championship, European Handball Championship, and Wroclaw was the UNESCO World Book Capital as well as European Capital of Culture.

For this occasion, an Olympic Swimming pool, a roller-skating track and Olympic Stadium has been renovated.

Polish President Andrzej Duda was a honorary patron of The World Games, the Ministry of Sport and Tourism, Polish Olympic Committee and numerous partners, educational institutions and sponsors were included in to the organization of The World Games 2017.

The real star of the event was an army of volunteers, young, 1900 students who were at service to all the participants 24 hours a day. They received a special thanks from Dr. Thomas Bach, the IOC president during the closing ceremony.

The World Games take place every four years in the year following the Olympic Games. The event showcases more than 25 sports, for example Dance Sport, Squash, Tug of War, Sumo and Karate.

Approximately 4,500 athletes and officials from more than 100 countries take part in The World Games.

Athletes compete for the gold medals in almost 180 disciplines during the event.

Here is the official report of the final results of the WAKO participation during The World Games:

The WAKO had 31 participating countries, in total 95 athletes (64 male and 31 female) fighting in 12 categories (8 male and 4 female).

WAKO competition was divided into two days with 172 persons representing it. The only WAKO discipline was K-1 Rules.

WAKO total quota for all officials is 172 persons.

Mr. Srdjan Bugarcic was appointed as a Technical Delegate and the WAKO Competition manager and the key person for communication with The World Games headquarters.

The final score of the competition of the best fighters in the World is:

Poland won the first place, Serbia on the second place and Russia is the third at the medal table.

THE OPENING CEREMONY

On Thursday 20th July the IOC President Dr. Thomas Bach declared the 10th edition of The World Games 2017 in Wroclaw, Poland Open. He addressed to the organizer, volunteers, athletes and the audience greeting all sport lovers, between the welcome speeches of Jose Perurena, the President of the International World Games and Rafał Dutkiewicz, the Mayor of the city of Wroclaw.



The impressive opening ceremony at the sold out Wroclaw Stadium was a perfect start for the biggest sport event ever held in Poland. After that, it's up to the athletes to dazzle, showcasing their sports in an outstanding and thrilling way.

At the march of the participants, one could see that the most numerous teams were Polish (218) and French team (193).

During ten days, 3,250 athletes from 111 countries competed in 31 sports (27 official sports and four invitational sports) to become the World Games Champion in one of 218 medal events.

The World Games is considered to be a stepping stone towards becoming part of the Olympic Games. In a Press Conference held before the Opening Ceremony for The World Games, the President of the International Olympic Committee Thomas Bach said that the IOC is "working very closely with The World Games" to help the organizing committees of future Olympic Games decide which sports to include in their programme.

The 10th edition of The World Games, in Wroclaw



provides the opportunity for sports to demonstrate that they are worthy of being in the Olympics.

Dr Bach explained: "We have a team here of observers who will look at all the sports and all the disciplines and then we will continue talking".

During the spectacular show, we saw fantastic performance of the singers and dancers, and a fantastic defile of the countries participating.

TWO TIMES KICKBOXERS WERE SELECTED AS THE ATHLETES OF THE DAY

Every day the International World Games Association awards prizes for male and female IWGA Athlete of the Day - powered by Tissot!

The WAKO was privileged two times during The World Games to take this award!

Among 31 sport present, we can be very proud.

The first day of the competition a Polish kick boxer Roza Gumienna was awarded as the female athlete of the day as she was the oath taker on behalf of all athletes during the Opening ceremony of the Games.

The jury of experts has selected Kick boxer Slobodan Mijajlovic (SRB) as Athlete of Day 7.

With Waterskier Natallia Berdnikava (BLR), Slobodan Mijajlović was awarded by the Vice President of IWGA Mr. Max Bishop.

The day of the kickboxing finals was at 27th July in the fully booked Orbita hall.

Fantastic atmosphere at the finals. Perfect organization, great fights, NO 1 audience.

The Olympic Channel was broadcasting live the event and according their evaluations, this was the most popular show during TWG.

WAKO kickboxing had many VIP guests at the competition: delegates from the Evaluation Commission of The World Games, a CEO from The World Games, delegates from Dutch Olympic Committee, Jordan Olympic Committee, the President of AIMS Mr. Stephan Fox, the chairman of Birmingham Organizing Committee of The World Games 2021. We spent a pleasant time with them, briefing them, explaining the K-1 rules, the scoring system and the

WAKO competition plan, as well as all other information they were interested in.

Moreover, he is in charge for all statistics WAKO has, concerning competition activities, what gives him credibility as the best informed personality about WAKO history. For his credits given in area of fair play spirit on the WAKO tournaments, competitions and internal relations, he was awarded by International Fair Play Committee during the Junior



Championships 2016 in Dublin. Mr. Desa was in charge in the standardizing and completing basic documents of WAKO federation concerning kickboxing rules, defining disciplines, protecting gear, all procedures and protocols, as well as other documents concerning technical issues in organizing competitions. From now on, Mr. Romeo Desa will be at President's disposal for any consultation needed and will put his knowledge to the service of WAKO.

The short introduction of the KICKBOXING SPORT







History facts:

In America 1974. Mike Anderson and his partners invented the new sport, "full contact karate" and that was the cornerstone of the sport later named KICKBOXING.

WAKO was initially called WORLD ASSOCIATION OF ALL STYLE KARATE ORGANIZATIONS and started its activity in Europe in 1976. The founder was Georg Bruckner from Berlin. The new rules and regulations were immediately created for the new contact fighting sport, including punches (hand

techniques) and kicks (leg techniques) for amateur fights with maximum use of protective equipment.

The new term KICKBOXING was used to define the sport and also WAKO name was changed into WORLD ASSOCIATION OF KICKBOXING ORGANIZATIONS and acted, since the very beginning, as the authentic Kickboxing Federation in the World.

From 1984, WAKO was led by Italian Ennio Falsoni, a former WUKO World Karate champion. As a very much open minded person, he laid the foundations of the Organization and gave a huge contribution for consolidating WAKO as respectable International Sports Organization.

Now, after decades of passionate work, Ennio Falsoni is honorable President of WAKO.

Kickboxing today:

Kickboxing is a modern contact fighting sport created on the basis of many traditional combat sports and martial arts. Kickboxing is a unique Western response to many Eastern martial arts.

Today WAKO kickboxing organization counts on 128 affiliated nations in the 5 continents, which are officially recognized by either their National Olympic Committees or by their relevant Government Sports Authorities.

Actual WAKO President is Prof. Dr. Borislav Pelević (Serbia).



WAKO is officially recognized by: GAISF - former SportAccord (Global Association of International Sports Federations), OCA (Olympic Council of Asia), WADA (World Anti-Doping Agency), IWGA (International World Games Association), Peace and Sport, International Fair Play Organization, AIMS (Alliance of International Recognized Members of Sport) IWG (International Working Group of Women in Sport).







WAKO organizational plan:

WAKO's main executive body is Board of Directors. WAKO has 20 experts Committees which are consisted of experts in each field, proposed by all WAKO members and approved by the Board of Directors.

The Committees are: Executive Com., Organizing Com., Referee Com., Technical Com., Health Com., Athlete Com., Coaching Com., Women Com., Sponsorship Com., Media Com., Development Com., Education & Student Com., Sport for All and Solidarity Com., Entourage Com., Integrity and Fair Play Com., Ethical Com., Legal Com., Disciplinary Com., International Relations Com., Arbitration Com.





WAKO Championships organizational plan:

WAKO is growing steadily all over the World promoting regularly Continental and World Championships (in all seven disciplines) and organizes World and Continental Cups and Open tournaments.

WAKO World Championships are NOT open competitions where everybody can participate. In **WAKO** Championships, only National teams are accepted. Each member country can present only 1 competitor in each weight class. Each kickboxer has gone through a long selection on National championships and qualifications in his country before competing at **WAKO** tournaments .

WAKO kickboxing disciplines (styles):

WAKO has 7 different kickboxing disciplines:

Tatami disciplines: Point fighting, Light contact, Kick light, and Musical forms.

Ring disciplines: Full contact, Low kick, K-1 Rules.

For the first time, kickboxing is at The World Games in Wroclaw 2017, competing in K-1 Rules discipline.

K-1 rules discipline

K-1 RULES - SHORT INTRODUCTION

Definition:

K-1 Rules is a kickboxing discipline where the intention of a kickboxer is to beat an opponent using legal techniques with full power and strength. Strikes must be delivered to legal target areas with focus, speed, and determination, creating solid contact. A win can be reached either by points (collecting more points than the opponent) or by knockout.


K-1 Rules safety equipment:

Kickboxer wear protection equipment from tested, approved and licensed manufacturers which consist of:

hand wraps (bandages), gloves, head gear, mouth guard, groin protection (male), breast protection (female), shin guard - only sock's type, covering the instep.

The kickboxer is wearing shorts (length: knees must be visible and naked) with kickboxing emblem, naked body. Female kickboxer wears breast protection under a sports top.

Short rules of kickboxing discipline K-1 Rules:

It is allowed to perform punches and kicks (arm and leg techniques, including knee).

Legal target areas:

- head (front face and forehead), side and top.
- legs (any part except front side of thighs and a knee)
 - -foot (for sweeps ankle level only).

Legal techniques:

- hand:

all boxing punches, back fist and spinning back fist, holding the head and shoulders for the only one knee kick, immediately.

- leg:

front, side, roundhouse, heel, crescent, axe, jump kick; shin kick to any part of the leg (except knee), body, and head; knee kick is allowed to the leg (except front side of the tight and knee), body and head; foot sweeps.

sl 13.19

Prohibited techniques:

- elbow techniques are forbidden
- grabbing and holding the opponent's leg and performing the punch and kick at the same time
- any wrestling techniques and performance of the fight on the floor.

All punching and kicking techniques have the same judging value.

Age of the kickboxers in discipline K-1 Rules:

The kickboxers in K-1 Rules can be from 19 - 40 ages old (male) and from 19-35 (female).

SUMMARY:

tatami. Very often the fighters in this age are applying not enough clear and correct techniques. In these fights It is a real challenge to keep the balance between the correct rules applying and the fighter's motivation support.

5. Who is more emotional: girls or boys when they lose the fight? Who cries more?

It is hard to define, boys are crying, girls too. Any age is crying—it depends on the character. Crying - this is some kind of emotional output, I have seen crying even multiple world champions after they have lost....

6. Have you experienced the flood of emotions after the fighter loses the fight?

Oh yes, for sure – every time. And I experienced it by various ways – fair, not fair...

7. Who is more agressive on the tatami- girls or boys?

I think boys are more aggressive in fight, but they are some cases we can see some fights with unexpected girl's aggression, as I said question of character and fighter's level.

8. What is the main characteristic of a good judge?

All requirements to the referees and judges are well settled in WAKO rules. I think beyond the perfect knowledge of the rules what's absolutely obligatory, the main characteristic of the good judge is the respect. Respect to the fighters, coaches and their work. But as well respect to himself and to the other judges in the team, because refereeing is always team work. If you are lead by the respect to everybody on the tatami you are able to keep the focus, to apply the rules correctly, to sort out any critical situation during the fight.

9. Speaking about education of the referees: is this level of education in WAKO enough for judges or referees or do we need to change something?

WAKO has always been focused on progress. Any progress is a result of improvement, and improvement needs changes. We in WAKO referee committee for tatami sports are working continuously on improving the referee work, analyzing every WAKO event passed. Actually we are working on some changes focused on more clear and comprehensive rules. We initiated new activities, which are to lead to a higher quality of referee work. Anyhow I consider these committee initiatives should bring better result if they are a part of a complex WAKO program for referee body development and if they are obligatory supported by and with the participation of the national federations. We are to help national federations to put up the level of national referees, then it will be easier to educate more qualified international referees/judges. This summer will take place the 1st WAKO referee training camp for tatami sports, Bulgaria is honored to host this memorable event.

10. What WAKO disciplines Bulgarian loves the most? Is there a difference what people like to train and what people like to watch?



1. Who is Ivan Ivanov? Introduce yourself please.

I'm 53 years old, married, two children. I graduated the High Economic school in Prague –Czech Republic – international economic relationships. My main job is international trade and international business project management. I have been active for years in Bulgarian kickboxing. Actually I'm vice-president of the biggest kickboxing club in Bulgarria – Ikken, chief referee for tatami sports in Bulgarian kickboxing and muay-thay federation, and since November2016 member of WAKO referee committee for tatami sports.

2. When and how you get involved in kickboxing?

I have been involved in kickboxing since 2005, when my son started training kickboxing. Myself I trained karate 8 years and reached blackbelt 2nd DAN in karate do.

3. What were your choices when we talk about practicing the sport? Which sports you tried out and trained? Are you still active in sport?

I'm sportive nature in general. I tried many sports with my school team – football, basketball, karate.. For sure karate was my favorite, unfortunately I had to stop training and practicing a long time ago because of a complicated injury. I still play tennis in my free time.

In WAKO I'm refereeing all tatami styles – pointfighting, lightcontact, kick light.

4. We have seen you refereeing fights among children in the smallest age. What is the main challenge when you are a judge in the fight between two little girls?

Always safety and health of the fighters are on first place. I'm more than careful when we have children on



I think Bulgarian like to train and to watch both ring and tatami styles. It is a big pleasure to see the fast growing popularity of kickboxing in Bulgaria.

11. Tell us something about current situation in WAKO Bulgaria. You are improving you ratings on medal lists? What is the secret?

Last four years our federation made a huge progress. We reorganized the budgets and put up the efficiency of using of all resources we have. We set up new programs for development of both ring and tatami directions. We started successfully national professional ring events. We improved the national sport calendar, we stimulated the clubs for a larger participation in WAKO world cups. We have the support of Bulgarian Ministry of sport and are in very good communication with all national media. The logical result is —kickboxing grew up in Bulgaria, we improved our position in WAKO medal list and we reached impressing success.

12. After such a long time in refereeing, what is the essence of the kickboxing sport according to your observations?

I will try to define what the essence of the kickboxing is for me: character and strength, spirit and moral, devotion and friendship.

13. What are the most memorable moments you had during your career in WAKO?

I had lot of wonderful moments during my carrier in WAKO, but it is always very precious for me to feel people respect – colleagues referees, fighters, coaches, officials, parents and spectators, it means for me – I did well the job I love. One moment is especially memorable for me: In 2015 I have been prized as Best referee of the National



Point fighting Championship of Russia. After I have got the prize, coaches were coming and saying to me: "Thank you, I voted for you!" Unforgettable!

14. Is your family happy with your job?

I have never asked them about this, but they are happy with me, so I'm sure they are happy with my main job, as well with my kickboxing job! Maybe if I find the way to spend a bit more time at home, they will be happier.

15. From the point of view of your main profession, how do you comment the place of sport in the World?

The philosophy of the company I work for is "bring people health". From this point of view, my main job has much common with the sport. Sport is to bring people health and spirit. And with your permission I shall add to this the famous logo of Bulgarian national team shirts: PEACE, LOVE, KICKBOXING!





Trainings with different age categories were held, where the trainers were introduced to the basic,

held, where the trainers were introduced to the basic, advanced and competitive techniques of this style. The work is enhanced by the technique-tactical performance of techniques with a partner, on a hook, and focus.

The seminar was also attended by Daimi Akin who was overwhelmed by the work and offered to hold the next seminar in the biggest club "FIGHTER" in Oslo. This club has 700 (seven hundred) members and operates at four locations in Oslo.

After completing the seminar, there was a visiting tour to the Norwegian Olympic Training Center.

Who is The Best Fighter?



Fourth WAKO World Cup in the World Cups series this year has gathered the best fighters all around the world. Remembering the fantastic organization of the editions before, this year The Best Fighter was one of the best ever!

Among 1816 entries of the competitors from 29 countries, we saw on tatami and rings fantastic spirit of the kickboxers who competed in all seven WAKO disciplines.

Italia was the most numerous team: 689 Italians in fantastic conditions well prepared for the competition, and also there were 273 Russians and 107 Slovenians.







This was the order of the best nations on the competition: 1. Italy, 2. Russia, 3. Slovenia.

The competition was very tough, the toughest way to the gold medal was in Point fighting senior men -69 kg, where we had 21 competitors!

The best fighter winning a gold medal was White Jordan (Ireland), silver was Veres Alex (Hungary) and bronze was Lo Prete Antonio (Switzerland).



GEAR MASK: A **PROTECTION** OR A **RISK**?



Following the rule that kickboxing should be a safe sport, the improvement of producing the safety equipment is a undisputable challenge. What are martial sports essentials? What we need to wear to protect ourselves during practicing real martial sport but at the same time to save the essence of the sport- fight between two athletes?

The most common opinion is that equipment protects the wearer rather than the opponent. But there are studies which concluded that receiving hits to areas on the body covered with the gear hurts just as much as receiving a hit without it. Yes, it hurts but not produces injuries. This is important.

The researches has been done on many levels and physicians may wish to consider recommending martial arts to patients as a beneficial form of exercise. They are relatively safe compared to

many other sports, and most martial arts injuries are comparatively minor. Risks can possibly be reduced by limiting exposure of inexperienced fighters, as well as using protective equipment, including mouth guards, eye/face protection, headgear, and padding.

That is the never ending story particularly when we talk about kids in sport.

What are the common head injuries during kickboxing championships? On the first place, nasal septal fractures and other injuries affecting the nose in general, there are traumas of the temporomandibular joint, dental traumas, eye injuries can reach up to corneal abrasions. These accidents are the most common in relation to other injuries, which are in general, very rear at WAKO championships.

One indecently fatal injury during the competition or even on the

training can affect that we lose a talented and dedicated athlete, moreover if he is in the young age. That's why is the topic about safeties one of the most important in developing our sport.

One can say the best protection for a kickboxing athlete is the best possible physical and technical preparation, the strong body, smart tactics in the fighting field where an athlete is doing everything not only to make a point but to protect him from dangerous attacks and know to avoid or block the ones. That is the perfection we seek in our sport, that is what makes someone a champion.

But, the reality is totally different, particularly among the younger categories. Naturally, no one can expect perfection in sport skills among children of that age. Among younger cadets, children between 10 and 12 age, the most important is when they are on the fighting area, they should show their fighting skill and finish the fight without serious injuries. Injuries can be got not only from the good punch of the better opponent, but also from the bad and unallowed punch of the opponent

Statistics say that the worst injuries fighters are afraid of are face injuries. They are the most visible, but also there can be hidden injuries, fractures of the fine face bones which doctors can discover hours after the fight,





when the athlete got the strong hit, is over.

There we come to the story about plastic mask which is designed to be put on the helmet, specifically engineered accessories for kids. Plastic mask has to keep our little ones safe from harm when they're practicing kickboxing, as well as when they are in the fighting field on the competition. Special plastic mask allows them to be released from the fear of unexpected harmful punch and let them focus on presenting their martial arts technique during the fight.

The point is it is the idea that well produced and designed plastic mask has the purpose of necessary protective equipment, with which your child can learn the basics, enjoy their martial arts training, join the competitions free of fear of injuries and most importantly, stay safe.

The question erases: if the plastic mask gives TRUE protection from injuries or it gives feeling of secure, only psychological feeling of the safety when it is worn?

We are opening another dilemma: if the plastic mask itself can make an injury on the kid who wears it and on the opponent who made a strong high kick, hit the mask and injured the foot?

The producer and accredited WAKO supplier stands at the attitude the mask is safe but the consumers must be responsible to provide the personal mask for every competitor- fit to the size of the head and helmet. It was noticed many coaches use the same mask for many competitors, even they have different sizes of the head dimensions. Mask should fit, not to be bigger or smaller than the helmet. The coaches should learn to use face masks correctly (proper fixing), according to the size of the helmet, and we will never have problems that have been so far very common at the championships: they start with the mask on, and take it off during the fight due to the inconvenience it makes to the fighter.

The only issue producers are working on now concerning masks is to improve the bottom edge of the mask, to make it softer. It was noticed that the sponge or rubber protection of the bottom edge of the mask has been dropped or it

has been misguided, after a very short term of the usage.

Researches should be done before any radical decision pro or contra.


What is for sure, is that plastic mask become WAKO brand, symbol of our dedication for maximal safety and protection of our competitors.

Shall we keep face masks as a protection and safety equipment for younger cadets in point fighting discipline? Should we revoke the safety equipment if it has proved insufficient or we should find solutions with producers to upgrading it?

WAKO is opening the debate. The word of the coaches and athletes is waiting to be heard.
